

ESOL (English for Speakers of Other Languages)



Employability Skills

Did you know an employer takes 5 -10 seconds to scan a CV? Does yours stand out from the crowd? Writing a CV when you have been unemployed for a while isn't easy, so this course will help you develop and communicate your strengths, skills and experiences. Sessions will focus on matching skills to work, learning about workplace values, presenting your personal information effectively, together with understanding salaries, taxes and budgets.

If appropriate you may also be able to gain units towards the OCR Employability qualification, at Entry 3, Level 1 or Level 2.

IT Xtra

This is a drop-in session for learners who want to improve their IT skills, especially those who are currently working towards the CLAiT or ECDL qualifications but need further practice to prepare for the test.

CLAiT – Word Processing

A lack of essential computer training can be a barrier to accessing information and gaining employment. This is a Level 1 course for learners who wish to gain a well-recognised certificate for IT users. When you have completed 3 units (Word, Excel, Online Communication) you will be awarded an OCR Level 1 CLAiT certificate. This session will focus on word processing and managing files and will help you gain the skills to pass module 1 of CLAiT.

Learners who wish to do this course need to have basic keyboard and mouse skills.

ECDL

This is a level 2 course for learners who wish to gain a certificate for IT users recognised by employers. The course is designed to help you to gain the skills and knowledge required to obtain the ECDL qualification. This qualification consists of 8

modules, which include using a computer and managing files, word processing, spreadsheets, databases, presentations, online communication and two theoretical modules on IT security and ICT concepts. The ECDL will qualify you to do a skilled job once you have gained some experience.

Learners enrolling on this course should have an OCR CLAiT qualification or similar skills.

Internet & E-mail

When: Thursdays, 11.30am-1.30pm

Where: Computer Room

Tutor: Pilar

This course is for learners who are interested in exploring the amazing possibilities of the internet and in using e-mail to communicate with family, friends, potential employers or even your MP! The session will help you to become proficient in searching for information, booking tickets, setting up an e-mail account, attaching documents and photos to an e-mail and more. Attending this class can also lead to obtaining level 1 accreditation for those interested in progressing to CLAiT.

Learners who wish to do this course need to have basic keyboard and mouse skills.

CLAiT – Spreadsheets

When: Thursdays, 5 - 7 pm

Where: Computer Room

Tutor: Pilar

A lack of essential computer training can be a barrier to accessing information and gaining employment. This is a Level 1 course for learners who wish to gain a well-recognised certificate for IT users. When you have completed 3 units (Word, Excel, Online Communication) you will be awarded an OCR Level 1 CLAiT certificate. This session will focus on Excel – creating spreadsheets and graphs – and will help you gain the skills to pass module 2 of CLAiT.

Learners who wish to do this course need to have basic keyboard and mouse skills.

Beginners IT

When: Fridays, 12 - 2 pm

Where: Computer Room

Tutor: Pilar

This course is an ideal opportunity to gain the most basic and essential

computer skills. If you haven't used a computer before or have little computer skills don't miss this class! You will learn at your own pace in a very friendly environment to ensure you gain the confidence you need to create, edit, format and print simple documents such as letters, posters and tables. You will learn how to change fonts and colours, add borders, insert pictures and more.

Let's investigate, Skills for Life ICT

When: Tuesdays, 1.30 - 3.30pm

Where: Computer Room

Tutor: Brian

This course provides varied activities, at your own level, to help you refresh and improve your computer, literacy and numeracy skills all at the same time. You will investigate topics chosen by the group, by collecting data, making sense of it and presenting it in an attractive format. Examples of possible topics for investigation might be: 'How far have Skylight Cafe customers travelled to get to the Cafe?', 'What is the best value source of bread in Oxford city centre?', but the best investigations will be the ones you think of yourself!

Ideal for anyone who enjoys asking, and answering, questions about what is going on around them, or members wanting to improve their report writing skills ready for college or employment.

You can achieve entry level qualifications as appropriate, and/or move on to other courses and qualifications.

Newsletter Group – Write It

During this session those participating in the Newsletter Group will work together to develop a plan for all aspects of the Crisis Skylight Oxford Newsletter. There will be opportunities to write articles, reports and features; find illustrations and take photographs; develop your IT skills (in the 'Publish It' session on Fridays) and explore the whole business of disseminating news. No experience is needed, just an enthusiasm to publicise the evolving story of Crisis Skylight Oxford and a willingness to learn new skills and work with others.

Newsletter Group – Publish It

During this session those participating in the Newsletter Group will have the opportunity to use a computer to produce a professional looking document and to make it ready for publication. You will learn how to use alignment, text boxes, pictures, borders and other elements of desktop publishing to create effective page compositions. By the end of the course you will be able to design and lay pages out and combine text and graphics that will help you communicate your message effectively and to make the Crisis Skylight Newsletter a big success.

There is an expectation that members will attend both Newsletter Group sessions, Write It and Publish It.

Literacy: Taking Issue

When: Tuesdays, 4 - 6pm

Where: The Garden Room

Tutor: Brian

This course will enable learners to develop their speaking, listening, reading and writing skills. After some introductory activities the group will work on current issues, either arising in the local and global media,

or that are concerns which the participants bring themselves. You will be able to gain a certificate in relevant OCN units of Adult Literacy and progress to the full OCR Adult Literacy as appropriate.

Ideal for members who enjoy discussing issues and finding out more by listening to other people's views, and are also interested in improving their reading and writing skills, or those who recognise that they are not great at listening to others, but want to improve!

Literacy

When: Thursdays, 11 am - 1 pm

Where: The Garden Room

Tutor: Brian

This course offers a range of ways of developing your literacy skills, e.g. group activities and discussions; practice questions; on-line activities; writing poems, letters and reports; phonics; and skills assessment. You will agree your own learning plan so that you can work at your own pace to brush up the English and literacy that you need, with support and teaching to help you. You will be able to gain a certificate in relevant OCN units of Literacy and progress to the full OCR Adult Literacy as appropriate, and as quickly as suits you.

Fast Track Literacy

When: Fridays, 1.30 - 3.30pm

Where: The Garden Room

Tutor: Karyn

Short courses to help you get an OCR Level 1 or Level 2 qualification in adult literacy as quickly as you like! This may be essential to getting on a particular college course or may help you get the job you want. You will get lots of exam practice and help with areas that you find more difficult.

Looking after your money

When: Thursdays, 1.30 - 3.30pm

Where: The Garden Room

Tutor: Brian

This course will help you be more confident to make your money do what you want it to. You will brush up on calculations with money, and list your money-in and money-out, and see how you can plan ahead better. If appropriate you may also be able to gain the Learning to be financially capable unit towards the OCR Employability qualification, at Entry 3, Level 1 or Level 2.

Numeracy in Bike Maintenance

When: Mondays, 11 am - 1 pm

Numeracy in Bike Maintenance helps you brush up on the maths skills that you may need to use in

this workshop, e.g. measuring and basic calculations. At the same time, you may also be able to gain a maths or numeracy qualification.

CREATIVE ARTS

Creative Printmaking and More

When: Mondays, 4.30 - 6.30pm and Thursdays, 3.30 - 5.30pm

There will also be a chance to try other art and craft techniques such as needlework, patchworking, and painting. No previous experience is necessary and you'll soon be producing exciting pieces.
