February was full of fun and quizzes; Member volunteer, 'M', organised an exciting Friday afternoon Crisis Quiz, with help from Eleanor, for the Coventry and Birmingham Skylights. The questions were challenging and thoroughly enjoyable. I also put my Quiz Master skills to good use as the staff took part in weekly quizzes to help them get through the lockdown.

February was also LGBTQ+ History Month which saw the annual month-long observance of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender history, and the history of the gay rights and related civil rights movements. Coventry, Newcastle and Birmingham Skylights celebrated together, inviting members for a lively discussion and fun quiz on Zoom with the opportunity to create personalised rainbow keychains and discuss LGBTQ+ history and culture.

As things get back to 'normal' we look forward to opening Crisis offices two days a week. The re-entry group continue to meet fortnightly to ensure that staff, volunteers and members return to an extra safe office. SUCCESS STORIES: REACHING THORUGH THE BARRIERS

This month we hear from Mel Goolding, one of our excellent Progression Coaches who has been supporting a member to move from overcrowded accommodation living with her parents into her own tenancy:

'After her privately rented tenancy ended, one of my members was living with her parents suffering ongoing mental health issues. After finally signing for her new tenancy, Crisis helped with the house move and a starter pack of essentials, without which she would have struggled to stay in her new accommodation. We also supported her application of a Community Support Grant, signposting to other agencies to apply for still other charity applications. I'm delighted to say that these were all successful,

she can also carpet her home.


She shared with me that the process was stressful and difficult and without our help she would not have made the leap from basic shelter to a settled home. She didn't realise how much was involved in taking on a new tenancy, and told me how much she appreciates all the support and help she's received. She pleased with her new place. We are just as pleased for her.'

I'm glad to say that I completed the challenge; 2800 sit ups done and just under £300 raised for Crisis! Thank you for your donations and support.

PROGRESSION: 'BETTER WHEN WE'RE TOGETHER'

Crisis Skylight are part of a newly formed working group led by Coventry City Council's Rough Sleeper Team. The **'Task and Finish Group'** will work together with partners from across the City to ensure those experiencing homelessness are placed in the right accommodation to meet their needs. The group will also support with move on routes out of homelessness for those leaving temporary accommodation, supporting them to prepare for and sustain their new homes.

I joined Crisis Skylight Coventry & Warwickshire team on 1st February as a Progression Manager.

I've been working in housing and homelessness for around 10 years, I've worked for local authorities and prior to joining Crisis I was working at Shelter, most recently as part of the Housing First management team. I have two girls who take up most of my free time outside of working!



Q.: What's a typical day like for you at Crisis?

My days at Crisis are varied, I could be attending

meetings with partner agencies, supporting staff with queries, or looking at reports. I'm looking forward to getting to meet members, volunteers, and staff in 'real life' in the not to distant future as currently lots of my time is spent on Zoom!

Q.: Have you ever volunteered and what was your experience of this?

I used to volunteer at a drama group for children with Downs Syndrome, it was great fun and seeing the children flourish and perform was amazing.

Q..: Cats or dogs?

Dogs all the way, although my children are trying to persuade me to adopt a cat.
