Why do we
need to

new?

- We need to know the true scale of homelessness within our communities, as there is a disparity between the official homelessness figures and the true numbers of people needing support
 - We can only structure our services correctly if we know who is experiencing homelessness in real time and can be reactive to their needs

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Achieve **functional zero** for people who are rough sleeping.

Functional Zero:

The total number of people experiencing homelessness in a cohort will be no more than the average # of those in that cohort who've moved into settled housing per month for the prior six months.

Why Bulit for Zero?

Built for Zero is an initiative that originated in America and has achieved success in Canada and Australia and now is emerging in Europe (France, Denmark and the UK).

Achieve **functional zero** through iterative changes.

Create a **By Name List** (BNL) which is a database with real time information about who is rough sleeping, the reason for their rough sleeping, what their support needs are.

Using the BNL

Service Coordination

Coordinate multi-agency support in meetings & help track progress to housing.

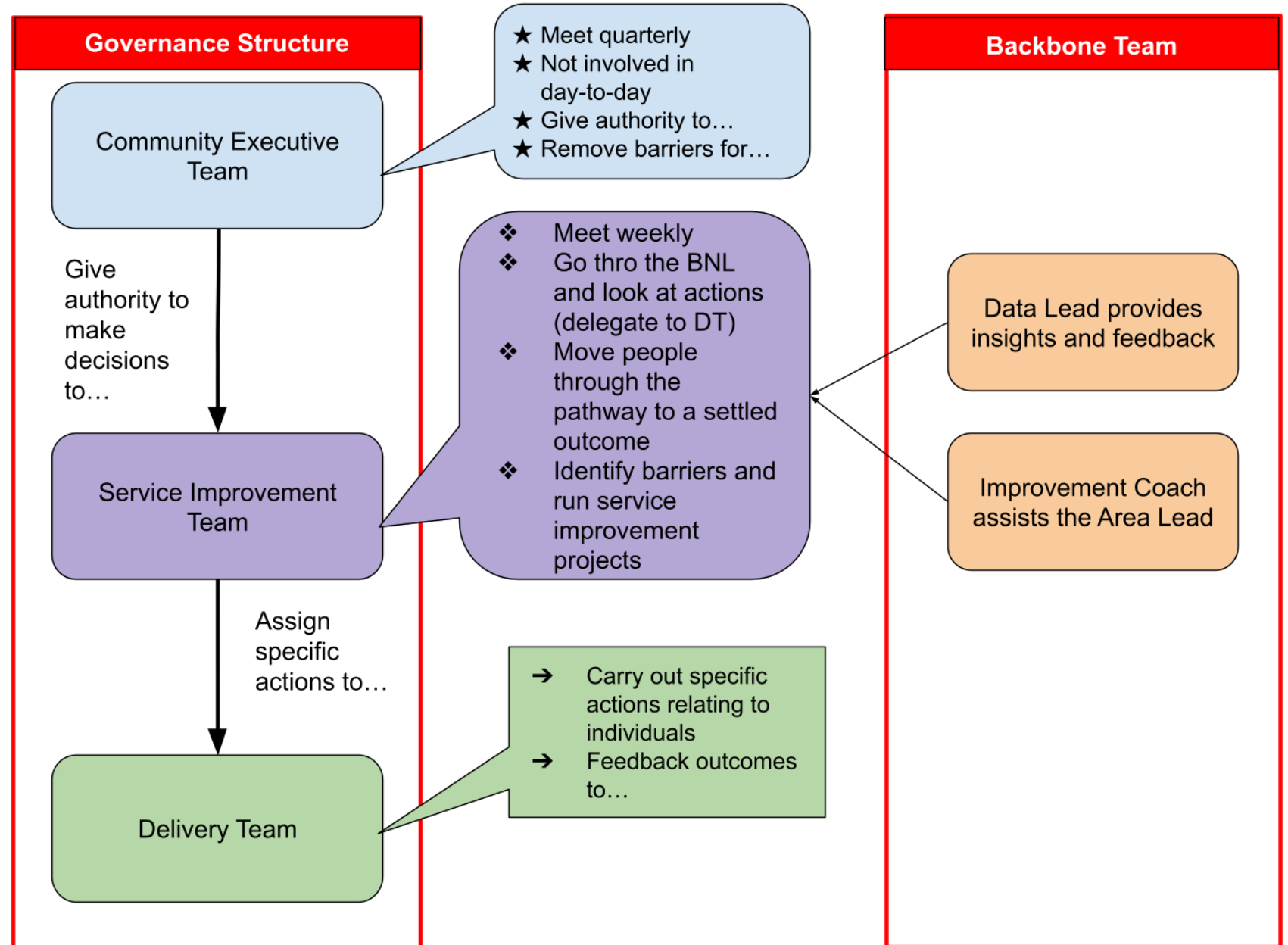
Improvement

Used as an improvement measurement to reach aim of functional zero.

Use of data to advocate for additional supports.

Governance structure



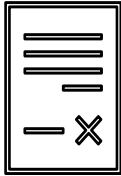
Where are we now?



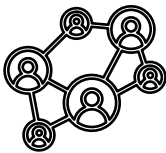
Community Executive Team and Improvement Team have had their first meetings



The fields for the By Name List have been created

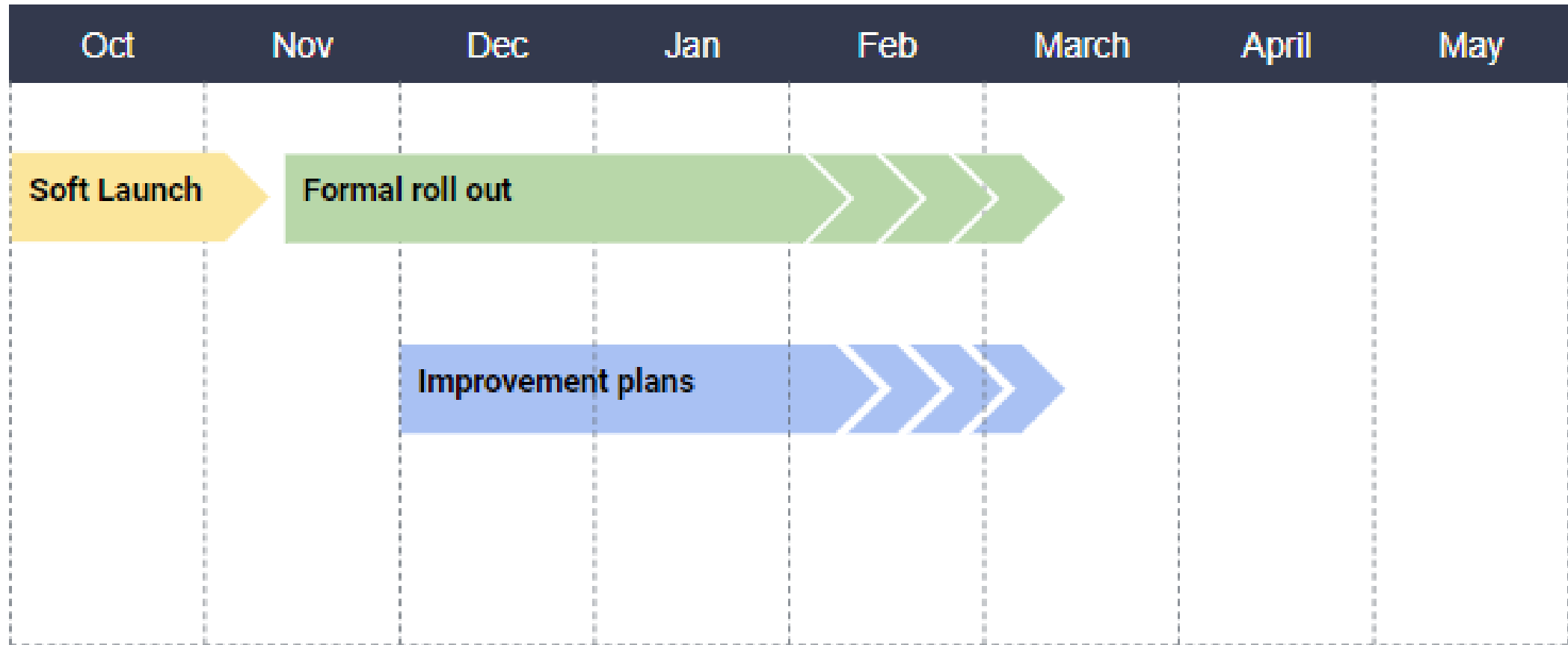


ICO and data experts have produced data sharing agreements that the partner organisations are in the process of signing, after which they will be able to refer individuals onto the By Name List
