It is a pleasure to welcome you to this carol service, whether you are a member of staff, volunteer, member or supporter. This evening provides us with the opportunity to come together and look back on the year in word and song.

Over the past year we have again seen an increase in the rates of homelessness across the UK. As a result of soaring rents and a lack of affordable housing, more people are trapped in temporary or emergency accommodation, sofa surfing, or sleeping rough.

Homelessness is not inevitable, and we know here at Crisis that it can be ended. Throughout the year, our skylight centres in England, Scotland and Wales have provided specialist one-to-one support so that people can end their homelessness for good. Winter brings

increased challenge and insecurity to the most vulnerable people in our society, so every year at Christmas and into January, Crisis helps thousands of people facing homelessness. The Birth of Jesus
